

EHV Notice

At this time (early June) the host facility is under a voluntary quarantine due to the EHV outbreak in the western states. If the facility is still under quarantine at the time of the show, all competitors will receive full refunds of all fees, entry and stabling.

We will be undergoing a No Fever Policy for all arriving horses: all horses with a temperature of 102 f + will be placed in quarantine and/or removed from the premises as directed by a veterinarian or facility management. Please check your horses temperature before traveling to the show

DIRECTIONS TO AMERICAN SPORTHORSE

From Highway 1 in Watsonville, take the Buena Vista exit and go west (towards the ocean) approximately 0.8 miles to 1177 Buena Vista. Look for the show and farm signs. From Highway 101, we recommend taking G11 or Highway 129 to Highway 1 North for hauling, especially goosenecks. Highway 152 is not suitable for most trailers and Highway 17 is marginal for safety reasons (no shoulder in case of trouble).

Farm has an electric gate, <u>which opens with a push button on entry and exit</u>. It stays open for only 30 seconds to allow one car to pass. If you find it open, wait for it to close and then reopen. The button to activate exit is at the top of the hill, not by the gate.

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

Details on Entries. Friday is a *separate* show from the Saturday/Sunday show. You MUST submit SEPARATE entry forms for each show, and pay separate fees for each show. One copy of all membership cards, etc., is sufficient.

Classes will be split into Open and JR/YR and A/A. Status is determined by USEF card; if no amateur designation on your card, you are in the Open Division. Management reserves the right to cancel or amend any class or add or change judges if deemed necessary. If your class is cancelled, you will receive a complete refund of all fees and the option to withdraw from all other classes without financial liability. Horses may be limited to TWO rides/day, excluding quadrilles or benefit classes.

Awards to 1st with two or more in a class, ribbons through 5th. Special awards in many classes, Awards ceremony Sunday afternoon for weekend high score trophies.

Entries will only be accepted via mail. No phone or fax entries accepted. No entries will be accepted without a US postmark. Completed entries will be accepted on a first received, first served basis. A completed entry will be filled out in its entirely, with ALL appropriate signatures and emergency data, payment of fees and copies of cards. Entries will not be accepted unless they are complete in every respect, on official entry blanks, and accompanied by all fees, signatures, and copies of membership cards and horse recordings. Incomplete entries will be returned to competitor and may be resubmitted after completion. A completed entry, using the current USEF release, available at the CDS or USEF websites, is required for every horse on the grounds. Closing date is Tuesday, July 12, 2011. These shows generally fill early. When show is full, all other entries will be placed on a wait list. At closing date, those on wait list will be notified via e-mail that they are on a wait list. If the show/s are not filled, post entries will be taken until show/s are filled. Ride times will be posted on the www.in-balance.com website and e-mailed to competitors two weeks before show. Include legible e-mail address on entry. It is the rider's responsibility to check the web site for ride times or contact show manager if ride times are not received. Mail entries to 10200 Love Creek Road, Ben Lomond, CA 95005. Make checks payable to "Santa Cruz CDS." Returned checks are subject to \$50 fee and must be cleared with cash or cashier's check.

- **Required fees:** See entry form. Required fees include USEF fees of \$15 (\$10 drug + \$5 assoc.); California State Drug Fee \$5; CDS Competition grant Fee \$2; and office fee of \$30. These fees are required for each entry, Coastal Classic I **AND** II. Post entries will incur a \$10 late fee per ride if accommodated. Any changes to an entry at any time, if accommodated, will incur a \$10 fee for the change. Refunds: After closing date, no refunds unless classes and stall is filled from wait list, less \$30 office fee. Before closing date, all fees refunded less office fee of \$30.
- Musical Freestyle Ride: In order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of higher level at a USEF recognized competition. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. The score cannot be obtained at the same competition at which you intend to ride the freestyle. Sound checks will be scheduled during breaks check with the announcer. CD format is required.
- For *Quadrille Classes*, please send a separate sheet with Team and Member detailed information as well as a short bio, however EACH rider and horse does need a standard entry and release completed as well.
- Stabling: Portable box stalls with doors will be available from noon Thursday through noon Monday. Stall fee is \$130 (tack or horse stall) for the duration of the show, standard size. Double sized stalls are available by request (double fee). No shavings included, please call 831-722-5669 to arrange for delivery of bedding or bring your own. Specify on stabling form any special requests. Please provide your own feed, buckets, cleaning equipment, hoses, etc. Limited permanent stalls assignments will be considered for special needs. Sharps containers available in office.
- **Feed and bedding** available from Royal Oak Feed for show deliveries (831) 722-5669. They will make one delivery a day so please call early to place your order. Preshow delivery of additional shaving for your stall will be made on Thursday, if or dered by Wednesday P.M. Messages on their answering machine will be checked before deliveries.
- **Footing and Arenas:** Our footing is a top priority and we maintain the rings regularly. Covered warm-up and outdoor competition arena are dust-free sand/synthetic. No longing in warm-up unless unoccupied. Show arenas close Thursday at 6 pm for preparation for show. Competition arena is standard size (20m x 60m) for all classes.
- **Food, drinks and coffee** will be available on show grounds from 7:30 a.m. à 5:00 p.m., Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Menu is an array of salads, sandwiches, wraps, snacks, desserts, and a variety of juices, coffee, and drinks.
- *Advertising* is available in show program and on grounds. Contract Anne Howard at (831) 336-2801.
- *Farrier and veterinarian* on-call during the show. Phone numbers will be posted on the grounds in stable area and at Show Office.

- All horses must wear *bridle numbers* at all times when not in a stall. Use of the warm-up arenas is limited to those who are entered in the show, and at the discretion of show management, will be further restricted to those warming up for the classes in progress if there is congestion.
- *Horse Show Office* will be open on Thursday NOON to 5:00 P.M. and will be open on all show days from one hour before the first scheduled ride until one hour after completion of the last scheduled ride.
- *Digital Still Photography* by Amy McCool. All competitors will be photographed throughout the show—we've paid your shoot fee! McCoolPhotos.com
- *Video services* available sign up with the videographer, Cindy Ewing, at the show.
- Unattended young children and dogs will be impounded and held for ransom.
 PLEASE, no dogs allowed outside of your car or truck. Absolutely NO SMOKING in or around barn areas or we will hose you down!
- *All classes* will be run in accordance with current USEF rules and specifications, unless specified otherwise. In situations that are not covered by USEF Rules, show management will have the final decision. Current USDF, USEF, and FEI tests will be used. Costume freestyle test sheet is available on www.in-balance.com.
- Membership statement. Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach, or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes area exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) lead line; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes, 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.
- All riders are reminded of the new rule regarding protective headgear. The host facility strongly recommends protective helmets for all riders at all times. A special daily "Brain Bucket" award will be awarded by drawing to those FEI riders who elect to compete in ASTM/SEI protective helmets, sponsored by The Wilder Family and Valley Medical Center Foundation.

The California Cup Freestyle Challenge Class

The Coastal Classic has encouraged development of freestyles at all levels since its inception. To this end, we offer the California Cup – a challenge to collect your best scores in both Open and Freestyle classes to put up for the \$1000 add-back award stakes.

To enter, you must have at least one freestyle ride and at least one non-freestyle ride at the highest test of that level over the course of the show. (For FEI classes: Intermediate 1 for Intermediate FS, and any GP test for GP freestyle.) Then, also enter the California Cup class (#390). Your best scores will be used to tally your California Cup percentage. The stake grows with more entrants – so prepare that freestyle and come ready to dance!! Winners have been Open, Amateur and Juniors in different years -- some years a first timer takes it all!! Consider this a challenge for creating freestyle excellence! All classes contributing to this award do count for USEF qualifying scores.

Winner: California Cup, championship sash, bragging rights, and 50% of the stake \$\$.

Reserve: 30% of stake \$\$ -- 3rd: 20% of stake \$\$.

Don't Miss the Costume Freestyle Class #322

\$500 Costume Freestyle, Stakes Class Can be a Solo, Pas de Deux/Trois or Quadrille 1st: \$250 of stake \$\$; 2nd: \$150 of stake \$\$; 3rd: \$75 of stake \$\$; 4th: \$25 of stake \$\$

This exhibition class is for education and entertainment purposes only and the scores earned will not count for USEF/USDF/CDS qualifying scores or awards. Every participant will receive an award. Class size may be limited by size of open show. Post entries allowed at no extra charge until Saturday, July 23 at 5 p.m. Additional donations for the charity are gratefully accepted at the Show Office throughout the show.

What is the California Dressage Society?

It is an organization whose purpose is to foster an interest among horsemen in Dressage. The program of the Society is educational, designed primarily to offer a framework in which individuals can progress with the schooling of themselves and their horses.

How does one foster an interest among horsemen in dressage? Since dressage is a personal challenge, to initiate a real understanding, a person must start with only a mere inkling of what it might be and must follow with an insatiable desire and definite pursuit to find out what it really is.

CDS is an opportunity - to share, to experience, to learn and to contribute. But the Society is by its very nature, limited, for it is a composite venture into a highly individualized world. The society does open the door. But it is the individual who must take the step.

What does the Society offer?

Educational activities on a statewide basis includes Riding Seminars, Instructor Seminars, National Symposiums and Judges' Forums. The local chapters sponsor clinics, competitions, films, discussion and informal schooling sessions.

Dressage (training or schooling) is an equitation term that means the gradual harmonious development of the horse's physical and mental condition with the aim to achieve the improvement of his natural gaits and perfect understanding with his rider.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Your scores will not count for the show if your memberships are not current! Check the requirements for your objectives carefully or ask the show management for guidance.

Memberahio Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions. Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or

owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF BM.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at D5HB competitions, sires and dams of horses in D5HB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or D5HB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in U5DF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy and opportunity classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, U5DF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a U5DF HID or LHR number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$75), 5-years (\$300), or like (\$1,500). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21* birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$60). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequar®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and the Great American insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$200) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (e-Membership): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM ownerlessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$25 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$25). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequar®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$70. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$95) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.








In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating* Member (PM) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse/recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
- A horse is not required to have registry papers.

Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (PM* or Business Member (BM)) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- *PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly.

USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur, and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.
